- **✓ PREVENT** The human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine can prevent cervical cancer.
- ✓ DETECT EARLY Regular Pap tests can catch early changes in the cervix.
- ✓ SCREEN If recommended by your healthcare provider, an HPV exam can detect
 the virus.
- **▼ TREAT -** When caught early, cervical cancer is very treatable.

Tips to prevent cervical cancer

- ✓ Make sure to get all three doses of the HPV vaccine to receive full protection against the 2 strains linked to most cases of cervical cancer. The vaccine is available to women 9-26 years old.
- Get regular Pap tests to catch early changes in the cervix before they develop into cervical cancer.
- Get an HPV test if you are 30 years of age or older and if it is recommended by your healthcare provider.
